## DEDICATION

This program is dedicated to the loving memory of A. McKay Brabham, Jr. (1916-2000), whose unselfish support and dedication to Mizpah United Methodist CHurch and Reunion will be greatly missed.

Few men have the ability to influence the hearts and minds of a people like Angus McKay Brabham Jr. did. On March 29, the 83-yearold pastor died quietly in his home in Columbia.

For 10 years, the small, soft-spoken man wielded the power of the pen as the editor of the SC Methodist Advocate, but it is his accomplishments during that period of history for which Brabham will be mostly remembered.

His often fiery editorials were the trademark of this lifelong crusade to fight for justice with the Gospel in one hand and the pen in



the other. His views were not always popular, but they weren't designed to be. Brabham's beliefs in social justice were rooted in his belief in God. No group was safe from his pen. He called things as he saw them.

"I was born a human being and a citizen, and later by choice I became a Christian and a minister," he said. "But I never knew that being a minister meant I should forfeit my rights and duties as a man and a citizen."

After resigning as editor, Brabham was appointed as the Spartanburg District superintendent. Brabham retired in 1985 as the pastor of College Place UMC in Columbia.

Brabham was a strong advocate for the homeless and this time and energy and support helped keep the Oliver Gospel Mission in downtown Columbia a functioning mission to combat homelessness. He began serving as trustee and chairman of the board of trustees of the mission in 1968, and was actively involved in its renovation in 1988-1990.

Brabham is survived by his wife, the former Helen Hutto of St. George; their son, Dr. A McKay Brabham III and his wife, Eugenia C. Brabham; grandchildren, Margaret W. Brabham, Heyward C Brabham, William W. Brabham, Angus M. "Gus" Brabham IV and his wife, Heather R. Brabham; great-grandson Angus McKay Brabham; sisters, Mrs. Robert E. O'Neal of Columbus, Ga., Mrs. Furman E. McEachern of Columbia. A son, William Hutto Brabham, predeceased him in 1985.

# NEWS TO MIZPAH'S EXTENDED FAMILY 2000

This year I have the opportunity to thank each of you for your support during this long and expensive work to restore Mizpah.

Thanks to Betty Jane Miller's untiring work and Bill Craven's photography, Mizpah was approved and recommend by South Carolina State Historic Preservation Office to be listed in the National Register of Historical Places. The recommendation forwarded to Washington, D. C. for final approval.

#### RESTORATION

This year was necessarily slow. The boards needed for the Ceiling 20 long 12" wide 1 " thick were difficult to find. The Men of Schofield harvested some exceptional fine timber in November and we were able to acquire enough to finish the interior. Kinard's Wood Preservation sawed it to the correct size then delivered, it here, the first week of December, to air dry inside the church. George was able to start installing it in May, hand planing each board just as our forefathers did in 1856. Look around to see if you can find them.

The second quarter we demolished David Sojourner's bam to salvage its sills. The beams salvaged were sawn into useable sizes, carried to West Columbia and turned on a lathe to make the balusters used in the handrails. A baluster from the altar served as template.

During third quarter installed a new electrical breaker box and electrical wiring. The front cement walkway was pored. Constructed a gravel bed with a drain line inside to carry away run off from church roof. A brick wall was built to obscure the HVAC. Interior of church and front porch was primed and painted. George built the front steps with ten stringers; in addition, he added some steel reinforcement, it should support a large group. Mizpah 1856 - 2000
