2001 Mizpah Reunion and Homecoming Minutes

Rains held off while the 80" Reunion of the Brabham, Kearse, Kirkland, McMillan and Moye Families and the Sixth Mizpah United Methodist Church Homecoming convened at the historic pre-Civil War church in Bufords Bridge, South Carolina.

Reunion president Clint Smoak (Moye family) called the meeting to order at 11:30 a. m. on October 14, 2001. Becky Swindell (Moye family) provided a prelude and piano selections for the service. Rev. Edward Stiltz, minister of the Olar charge, gave the invocation.

"Inspiration comes from many places - God's house, God's people, God's words," said Betty Jane Miller, "but today it comes from T. Benton Young." Young wrote the poem, "The Spirit of Buford's Bridge," which Miller gave as a dramatic reading to the congregation.

Music was provided by the Swindell and Keel families - the Moye Family Singers -- who presented an encore version of a song written about Mizpah. Doug Keel accompanied the delightful presentation on the guitar.

Clyde Kearse welcomed everyone to Mizpah, and reported on the progress of the restoration. The new restroom facility has been added, George Kearse has installed the shutters, memorial plaques were installed for windows and doors, and a memorial brick walkway was added to the front entrance. Kearse thanked all who have worked to keep the church ready for future generations,

The minutes of the 2000 meeting were approved as presented in the 2001 program book. Ched Kearse gave the nominating committee report. On motion of Bill Craven, the congregation approved the nomination of the following officers: 2002 Reunion president, Robbie Kearse (Kearse family); 2003 Reunion president, Mickie Brabham (Brabham family). Amanda Morris will assume the duties of treasurer and Carol B. Varn will continue as secretary. Clint Smoak introduced Robbie Kearse, 2002 Reunion president, to the congregation.

Andrew Chandler, representing the South Carolina Department of Archives and History, said of the restoration, "We salute you for very important work that has been done here." He noted what a delight it was to be invited to share this gathering, and brought greetings from Roger Stroup, director, and Mary Edmonds, deputy director.

President Smoak acknowledged the official Reunion family count: Brabham - 46; Kearse - 77; Kirkland - 39; Moye - 16; McMillan - 5. Also recognized were: Mary Carlton Lull, of Berkeley, California, who traveled longest distance; and 5-week old Benjamin Brabham. and 90-year-old Maura Mayfield, the youngest and oldest attending.

Genie Bellamy introduced a lifelong friend, Bill Craven, as the day's speaker. She said Craven had been an Eagle scout, a newspaper columnist, and a county agent in South Carolina and Georgia for 38 years. Among many other accomplishments, she noted he had been an Olympic torch bearer as the flame traveled to the Atlanta games.

Craven noted that it was an honor to be the day's speaker, and for the families to gather this day in this sanctuary. He thanked those responsible for the restoration at Mizpah, saying that with this restoration Mizpah becomes a "beautiful gate to heaven." He futher observed that though we owe many for this restoration, we also owe many before restoration too. Many have sustained Mizpah through all its difficult times - through wars, the boll weevil, the Depression. "Mizpah," said Craven, "is us."

Following the speaker's presentation, the families sang the traditional hymn, "Blest Be The Tie That Binds." Rev. Stiltz gave the benediction and blessing, and the families ended the day with fellowship and a covered dish dinner on the grounds. A highlight of the meal was the lemonade prepared by Robbie Kearse and family.

July – Water damaged ceiling and wall panels were replaced and repainted.

August – Added additional water lines and faucets to supply the cemetery grounds.

August -- Insulated attic of sanctuary.

Sept. – The old rest room was moved.

Sept. – Stops were placed for drive way entrance gates.

MIZPAH mysteries: Some think the sound in the sanctuary has changed, there seems to be an echo and voices do not carry as well as before the restoration. Your thoughts?
