

Sadie Harter Cooner

Sadie Harter Cooner, known in Bamberg County for her musical talents, died last Friday morning, April 4, 2003, at the age of 104, at the Bamberg County Hospital.

Although she was a petite Southern lady, she touched the lives of many with her grand love of music. Known to many as "Miss Sadie", she enjoyed all types of music, but "Ragtime" was her favorite.

She played the organ at Trinity United Methodist Church for over 55 years and shared her talent by playing the piano for many groups. She played at weddings, funerals and many civic programs, and clubs, including the Men's Bible Class at Trinity United Methodist Church and the Lions Club.


Miss Sadie became a member of the National Federation of Music Clubs in 1922. At age 99, she gave a concert to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of that organization.

In Bamberg, she founded the Apollo Music Club and served as its president for several years and the secretary for "many, many years."

She loved people, enjoyed stories, jokes, and being with her friends of all ages. She was active in the United Methodist Women Circles. Miss Sadie was also a member of the Golden Age group and attended their meetings until her death.

Born in Allendale on September 11, 1898, she was the daughter of Julia Platts and Willie E. Harter. She attended the Fairfax School and Columbia College, graduating from there in 1919. There, she served as a Student College President. After graduating, she taught several years in Olar.

In 1922, she married Roy E. Cooner and moved to Bamberg. Mr. Cooner died in 1965.



Survivors include her niece, Anne Harter Wilson and her husband, Jim; and a niece-in-law Marian B. Harter, all of Salisbury, N.C.; three great nephews-Steve, Mike, and Rick Lentz; one great niece Julie L. Bingler; and many cousins. Her two brothers predeceased her - William H. Harter and Jay Carlisle Harter.

Her funeral was held Sunday, April 6, at 3 p.m., at Trinity United Methodist Church in Bamberg. Rev. Jim Dennis officiated the service and burial was in the South End Cemetery.


