## 2003 Mizpah Reunion and Homecoming Minutes

The 82nd Mizpah Reunion was held October 12, 2003, at the historic church near the old town of Bufords Bridge, South Carolina. Rev. Edward Stiltz, pastor of the Olar charge, offered the invocation after the opening hymn, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing."

Dr. A. McKay Brabham III (Mickey), Reunion president, welcomed the group of more than 200 descendants of the five reunion families or clans. Brabham said "Mizpah" is a place that serves as a beacon or watch place in the Bible, and asked the congregation to pause to remember our forebears and to think of those to come.

The program consisted of an old time songfest, led by Becky Keel Swindell and Mary Carolyn Watson. Songs included: "I am Thine, O Lord;" "Take the Name of Jesus with You;" "Rock of Ages;" "The Beautiful Garden of Prayer;" "The Church in the Wildwood;" and, "Amazing Grace." Mrs. Watson, pianist, played "Take it to the Lord in Prayer" for the offertory.

President Brabham took the traditional family count with the following results: Brabham - 54; Kearse - 73; Kirkland - 75; McMillan - 3; and Moye - 6. Members came from near and far to spend the day with family. Sgt. Bruce Fitton, currently serving in the military in the Middle East, travelled the farthest to attend the Reunion, while Donnie Ayer had to travel only about one-half mile from his home to attend.

The Treasurer's Report was accepted as printed in the program. The nominating committee suggested the following slate of officers, which was accepted as presented: Dickie Kearse (McMillan family) - 2004 president; Caroline Watson (Kirkland family) - 2005 president; Carol Varn (Kirkland family) as secretary; and Laurence Wells (Kearse family) as treasurer.

Amanda Morris who had served as treasurer was thanked for her many years of dedicated service in that capacity.

Bill Craven provided a booklet, featuring a number of photographs of the Mizpah restoration, to be left in the sanctuary for those who may visit. Betty Jane Miller read T. Benton Young's poem, "Bufords Bridge." Members learned that since the last reunion, an historic marker had been placed at the intersection of US Highway 301/321 marking the location of the old town.

The service ended with the singing of the traditional closing hymn, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." Rev. Edward Stiltz offered the benediction and blessing before the congregation adjourned to the church grounds for dinner. A photographer was on site to take group photographs.





## THOSE WE REMEMBER

#### Olin D. Kearse - Dancer, Teacher

Olin D. Kearse, 73, formerly of Blue Bell, who taught ballet and staged dance performances in Montgomery County for more than 40 years, died of complications of diabetes Aug. 10 at a clinic in Alpharetta, Ga.

A native of South Carolina, Mr. Kearse was the first male in his family in six generations who didn't become a lawyer. Instead of practicing at the bar, he practiced at the barre and studied dance in Philadelphia while working at a friend's manufacturing plant in North Wales.

In 1950, he danced with the Metropolitan Opera Ballet Company in New York and the next year joined the American Ballet Theater. After only eight months with American Ballet, he temporarily lost his eyesight because of a congenital condition. When he regained his eyesight, he danced in roles with the Royal Danish Ballet and the Paris Opera Ballet. His vision was not

sufficient, however, for the rigors of performing, and in the early 1950s he opened the Olin Kearse School of Ballet in Ambler.

"When I started teaching, the first month or so I wasn't very happy," he told a reporter in 1983, "but the first time I saw a child do an arabesque properly placed and knew I'd helped her to do it, well, that felt great."

Mr. Kearse established Ambler Youth Ballet Company later it became Montgomery County Ballet Company as a performance venue for his students. The Olin Kearse School of Ballet, now Pennsylvania Dance Conservatory, and his company, now Philadelphia Dance Theatre, were taken over by his former student, Joy Delaney-Capponi, when Mr. Kearse retired in 1997.

Among the performances lie staged were *California Poppy*, a tribute to Russian ballerina Anna Pavlova; *Festivals*, a celebration of dance throughout the world; and the second act of *Giselle*.

At a rehearsal the week before Giselle's performance in December 1987, Mr. Kearse told a reporter: "Can you believe I painted sets for 16 hours on Wednesday [the day before Thanksgiving], and I had 10 people the next day for dinner? I was ready to go out and get a canned ham."

A gourmet cook, Mr. Kearse often hosted elaborate dinners for 30 to 40 people in Blue Bell and at his summer home in Cape May, said Tom Yemm, his companion of 31 years. "I'd be washing thousands of dishes," Yemm said.

He also collected antiques and was an accomplished watercolorist, Yemm said. He exhibited work at local galleries and studied in Maine with Jamie Wyeth.

Mr. Kearse had lived in Duluth, Ga., since 2000.

In addition to Tom Yemm, he is survived by several cousins.

A memorial service will be held at 2:15 p.m. Sept. 18 at Upper Dublin Lutheran Church, Susquehanna Road and Butler Pike, Ambler.
