#### 2006 Minutes

### Mizpah Reunion and Homecoming

On Sunday, October 8, members of the five Mizpah clans met at the historic church near Olar, South Carolina, for the 85d' Reunion and the 11" Homecoming of Mizpah United Methodist Church. Steve Kemmerlin (Kearse family) served as the 2006 Reunion president.

President Kemmerlin called the meeting to order after a piano prelude, "Sweet Hour of Prayer," by Mary Carolyn Watson. Rev. Edward Stiltz, of the Olar Charge, offered the invocation. The congregational sang the hymn, "Faith of Our Fathers." During the program, Betty Jane Miller recited the poem "The Spirit of Buford's Bridge."

The minutes and treasurer's report were accepted as printed in the 2006 Reunion program. Family counts were: Brabham - 32; Kearse - 75; Kirkland - 52; McMillan - 11; and, Moye - 19. President Kemmerlin recognized Celia Hastings (Kearse family) as the youngest person present, and Clarice Brabham O'Neal and Louise Kirkland Kearse as the oldest. Nan Campbell O'Neal of Denver, Colorado, traveled the greatest distance to attend the Reunion. Bobby Clayton of Colston, SC, was recognized as a first-time attendee.

Ched Kearse gave the nominating committee report, and the following officers were elected. Michael Swindell (Moye family) will serve as 2007 Reunion president. Laurence Wells will continue as treasurer, and Carol Varn will continue as secretary.

Philip Morris spoke to the group about publication of a new Mizpah book, to update the 1970 edition. Plans call for the book to be completed and available for the 2007 Reunion. Each of the five families has a contact person for questions and to provide updated information. Deadline for information to be included will be June 2007.

President Kemmerlin offered special recognition for the Bobby Kearse family which has made and served delicious lemonade for years. This is the last year the family will be able to do this. President Kemmerlin noted that this family had begun to make lemonade for the Reunion after Bobby Kearse returned from World War II. Mike Watson offered that the tradition had been around even longer, because he and Will Kirkland had first made lemonade for the Reunion. Kemmerlin asked for anyone who might want to continue this tradition to let it be known.

Kemmerlin introduced the speaker of the day, Bernard Kearse, of Atlanta. Kearse is an attorney, author, radio show host, Sunday school teacher and frequent lecturer, who chose as his topic "Follow your Passions." Kearse, who grew up in Columbia, noted the strong roots of Mizpah Church and said that "faith and confirmation of family" is what we're about.

The service concluded with the congregational singing of "Blest be the Tie that Binds" and a benediction and blessing by Rev. Edward Stiltz. Dinner on the grounds followed. The 2007 Reunion is scheduled for October 14, beginning at 11:30 a. m.
