2009 Minutes Mizpah Reunion and Homecoming

The 88th anniversary reunion of the Brabham, Kearse, Kirkland, McMillan and Moye families and the 14th Mizpah United Methodist Church Homecoming convened October 11, 2009 at the historic church.

The service began with a piano prelude "I Love to Tell the Story" by Mary Carolyn Watson. President Juliana Hughes (McMillan family) called the meeting to order, noting that though she lives in Atlanta, her heart is in Bamberg, and she was "proud to be here."

Rev. Edward Stiltz (Olar Charge) offered the invocation. Betty Jane Miller read Benton Young's poem, "The Spirit of Buford's Bridge," which was followed by the congregational singing of "Bless Be the Tie that Binds."

The 2008 Minutes were approved as printed in the 2009 program book, and the Treasurer's Report was accepted. Dr. Watson asked everyone to participate in a group picture on the front porch of the church after the service. Also, anyone willing to share their own Mizpah photographs should contact Philip Morris (for next year's program) or Clyde Kearse (for the website).

Ched Kearse introduced the speaker, Dr. Michael C. Watson, calling him a true son of Mizpah (by marriage) and a true leader in the Methodist Church, where among other things he started the United Methodist Volunteers in Mission program. Watson's topic was "What do you want most out of life?" He spoke of his life as a rural physician in Bamberg, which gave him the opportunity to make many wonderful friends,. He said when he puts his feet on the floor in the morning, he knows he is blessed to be able to help someone today .

The service ended with the congregation singing "God of our Fathers." The benediction and blessing were offered by Rev. Stiltz, Following the service the congregation enjoyed dinner on the grounds, which was catered for the first time by Cheryl Hoffman of Bamberg,

Martin J. And The Rest Of His Family As recorded by Daniel Winston Williams

On August 17th 2009, an e-mail circulated between me and a longtime friend Alice Allen, which would forever change how my family thought about our past. She had just given me the news of her marriage and I called to congratulate her on the family. We talked about her new hobby of grave marking and Genealogy and I explained that I had been unable to find information about some of my family. I gave her the name of Hallie Benjamin Brabham and by August 20th she had tracked my Brabham ancestors back through the Civil War, The Revolutionary war and into Scotland as so many of the Mizpah family are familiar.

On September 28 of 2009 I was the proud father of my first child, Ansley Marie Williams. In the next few days and months more information poured in about the old Brabham name of which we had not previously known anything about. The search for my family included meeting many wonderful people and visiting many interesting places.

For as long as my Grandmother had been alive no one knew anything about her Grandfather Martin Brabham, or even what his name was. She was born in the small community of Seigling just outside of Allendale on the Concord Church road. She didn't know her Grandfather or her uncle "Jim" and she had little knowledge of her Aunt Tillie Elkins. This all changed with the many week's of research my friend did. We were able to find this information thanks in great part to the various family members who had the foresight to write books like "Mizpah" and record other facts about the family.

Since starting this search I have taken my Father, Sister and two of my Aunts to see the graves of the family patriarchs. I only wish I could have done this for my Grandmother.

I lived with my Grandparents, until their death and often asked about the family with answers of little more than a few amusing stories. I would ask about the "Good-ole-days" and in time I realized they were anything but good. Life was very hard for them and so many others of their time. Perhaps that hardship kept the family in the dark about their ancestors but now, thanks to the help of so many people like Alice, Betty Jane Miller, Clyde Kearse, and the Proctor family, more of my family can appreciate the discovery of our extended family and preserve this information for years to come.

Our recorded lineage begins with Joseph and Flora McPhail Brabham, the first Brabham to come to America. It continues with Joseph and Sarah Clarke Kirkland Brabham and on to their ninth child, Martin James Brabham, who was recorded in the Mizpah book sometimes as "John Martin" after the lawyer who represented his father in a court case. It continues with Martin's

second son Hallie Benjamin Brabham. As I mentioned he was the only person we had any knowledge of on the Brabham side of the family.

There was talk of "Jim" Brabham but it really was only talk that Hallie had a brother. I have since seen his grave at Allen's Chapel and his full name is James Medicus Brabham.

Hallie was married first to Atlos in 1909 and had two children, Clio and Cora. When Atlos died he married Clara Elizabeth Ferguson and they had seven children. Three of his children are still alive, their names are; "Nora" Riley of Barnwell, Verna Proctor of Warrenville S.C. and Shirley Johnson of Augusta, Ga.

My grandmother, Edna Brabham, died in May of 2002 but while she was married to Alton Williams of Graniteville; they had two sons, Billy Albert Williams and Alton Winston Jr.

Bill married Lois Folk and had two daughters Letitia and Joane and a son, Billy. He operated the Folk funeral Home in Williston until his death in 2000. The business is still owned and operated by his three children and their families.

My father, Alton Winston Jr. recently retired from the Hardware industry. I work as a Sergeant in the Augusta Fire Department. My younger sister, Andrea Michelle Williams, has an MBA in education and teaches third grade at Byrd Elementary school in Graniteville.

There is a lot of work yet to be done on the family tree as more information is needed about Jim, Hallie, and Tillie Brabham, but I keep hoping that, like panning for gold, the next big strike

will uncover the information I need. I'm proud to call myself part of the Brabham family and I look forward to the coming months and years when I can meet more Mizpah Family members. We have a rich history to nourish the many branches of our family tree and I am excited to do my part to continue its Christian heritage.

Old Town, Buford's Bridge

Probably the oldest community in Bamberg County is Buford's Bridge which was once a thriving little village. Major William Buford's bridge over the Saltcatcher, as the Salkehatchie River was then known, is mentioned as early as 1792 in legislative journals. The settlement grew as the result of the bridge crossing the nearby river, and its position at the intersection of the road from Walterboro area to Barnwell Court House, and the road from Orangeburg to the Savannah River. It was first known as the Crossroads.

The early settlers in and around the village were the Kirklands, Brabhams, McMillans, Kearses, Moyes, Dickersons, Barkers, Hayes, Ayers, Best, Brelands, Ritters, Priesters, Grimes, Harleys, Wilsons, Knights, Rushs and Rileys. In the first US census taken in 1790 are shown in the area five Kirkland families, one McMillan, two Brabham, and two McPhails. On Mill Atlas 1818 designated home sites are those of M. Moye, the Ayers family, A. Breland, and a Mrs. Hews living near the bridge.

Lewis Malone Ayer, signer of the Ordinance of Secession and member of the South Carolina House of Representatives 1848-1842, was born in 1821 at "Patmos," his father's plantation near Buford's Bridge. Mr. Ayer was also elected to the U.S. Congress but the Confederate War intervened.

The first church in the community was Philadelphia Meeting House, built by the Methodists and Baptist to be used as a union church. In 1832 the two denominations disagreed and Philadelphia was given to the Baptists, and a Methodist church, the first structure of Mizpah, was built on land given by Robert C. Kirkland. In 1856 a new building was erected for this church two miles westward of the original location.

The Barnwell Baptist Association records Philadelphia church as being originated in 1827, and disbanded by 1901.

The school, Philadelphia, obtained its name from the church and stood opposite the branch bearing three names: Alligator Branch, having its source in Alligator Bay, The School House Branch, and Kirkland's Mill Creek which ran North to South and emptied into Salkehatchie River.

By 1880 the community numbered 1.567 persons, of whom 430 were white, and 1,137 were black. Though the community was well established by the late 1700's the village was not incorporated until 1889 and the area included was within one mile and in every direction of the crossroads near the bridge.

Buford's Bridge loss of population is attributed to many of the families moving nearer the railroad junctions as they were established, and to Sherman's devastation of the village. Mizpah alone stands in mute testimony to the glory of the past.
